- 1- π i or \dagger used for any word in general.
- 2- ϕ or θ used for words that begin with any of the following letters: B, I, P, N, N, M
- 3- $\hat{\pi}$ or $\hat{\tau}$ used for words <u>not</u> begin with any of the following letters: \hat{B} , \hat{I} , \hat{I}
- 4- NI plural "the" for both masculine and feminine. General use.
- 5- NEN plural "the" for both masculine and feminine. Specific use. when a noun is followed by another noun.
