In English, the preposition 'of' comes between two nouns to indicate possession of the second to the first. For example, "the book of Mark"  $\rightarrow$  Mark owns the book.

- 1.  $\mathbf{NTE}$  can be shortened to  $\mathbf{N}$  and attached to the beginning of the second noun.
- 2. In front of nouns that start with one of the letters  $\mathbf{B}$ ,  $\mathbf{M}$ ,  $\mathbf{\pi}$ ,  $\mathbf{\Phi}$  and  $\mathbf{\Psi}$ ,  $\mathbf{N}$  is converted to  $\mathbf{M}$ .
